SUPPLIES NEEDED

You will need the following:

- 10 Sheets of Cardstock (8.5" x 11")
- 10 3 mil Laminating Film


DIRECTIONS

- Print pages 2-13 two-sided. Laminate the story pages.
- Print pages 14-21 two-sided. Cut the "letters" along the gray line.
 Laminate all the letters and cut them apart.
- As students arrive, give them a few letters and ask them to look up the verses and fill in the blanks using a transparency (wet erase) marker.
- During class, read the story while holding up the pictures. When you come
 to the verses in the lesson, have the students take turns reading their
 "letters." At the end of class, they should put their "letters" in the correct
 "mailbox" (see Epistles Mailbox Bulletin Board).

Remember back to our very first lesson? The apostle Paul wrote to the Christians in Corinth how they were all apart of one body of Christ. Each member had a different gift or talent to use in the service of God. Some were prophets, some were teachers, some worked miracles, etc.

Well Paul wanted them to know that no one talent was more important than another talent. No matter what role they had in the church, they needed to have the right attitude. Paul said the most important attribute to have is...can you guess? (LOVE)



182 CORINTHIANS

Hold up the picture:

We're going to spend most of our time in 1 Corinthians chapter 13, so everybody turn there in your Bibles. Let's read these verses.

Let the students take turns reading the "letters" (NASB):

1 Cor. 13:1 – If I speak with the tongues of men and of angels, but do not have <u>love</u>, I have become a noisy <u>gong</u> or a clanging cymbal.

1 Cor. 13:2 – If I have the gift of prophecy, and know all mysteries and all knowledge; and if I have all faith, so as to remove mountains, but do not have love, I am nothing.

1 Cor. 13:3 – And if I give all my possessions to feed the <u>poor</u>, and if I surrender my body to be burned, but do not have <u>love</u>, it profits me nothing.

Ask / Discuss:

Imagine you are trying to read the Bible and someone stands up in class and starts clanging cymbals together...how annoying would that be? That's not showing love or consideration for one another is it? (No it's not)

We can do all sorts of good deeds, like feeding the poor, but Paul says if we don't do those things with love, we are what? *(Nothing)*



182 CORINTHIANS

The next section in chapter 13 is quoted often. You might have heard it before...

Let the students take turns reading the "letters" (NASB):

1 Cor. 13:4-5 – Love is patient, love is <u>kind</u> and is not jealous; love does not <u>brag</u> and is not arrogant, does not act unbecomingly; it does not seek its own, is not provoked, does not take into account a wrong suffered,

1 Cor. 13:6-8a – does not rejoice in unrighteousness, but rejoices with the <u>truth</u>; bears all things, believes all things, <u>hopes</u> all things, endures all things. Love never <u>fails</u>,


Ask / Discuss:


Have you ever heard those verses before? (Answers might vary...maybe at a wedding) Sometimes it's good to reread these verses to yourself, but put your name in place of the word "love," like this:


Teacher is patient, Student 1 is kind and is not jealous; Student 2 does not brag and is not arrogant..."


Reading it that way will help us to see our own actions and attitudes, and see if we are measuring up to God's standards for love.



















Have you ever wondered why we don't have miracles or speaking in tongues today? Well in the next section of 1 Corinthians 13, Paul explains why there was a need for all these different gifts and talents in the early church and what will happen to them. I'm going to read it while you follow along.

Read Verses (NASB):

1 Cor. 13:8-12 - but if there are gifts of prophecy, they will be done away; if there are tongues, they will cease; if there is knowledge, it will be done away. For we know in part and we prophesy in part; but when the <u>perfect</u> comes, the <u>partial</u> will be done away. When I was a child, I used to speak like a child, think like a child, reason like a child; when I became a man, I did away with childish things. For now we see in a mirror dimly, but then face to face; now I know in part, but then I will know fully just as I also have been fully known.

Ask / Discuss:

These verses might be a little difficult to understand, but I want you to think of a puzzle. When you have a bunch of puzzle pieces, you don't have the whole picture yet; you only have a part of it. Remember that the early Christians did not have the completed NT to refer to. That's why they had different gifts of miracles, prophecies, and speaking in tongues, along with Paul's letters. Everyone had a little piece of the puzzle and they needed to put their pieces together to make the Word of God complete. But once the puzzle, the New Testament, was completed, they would no longer need the spiritual gifts from the Holy Spirit and those gifts would be done away with. Does that make sense? (Yes) Paul also describes it as looking in a dim mirror, the image isn't as clear as seeing someone face -to-face.

Paul then finishes the chapter with another famous verse:

Let the students take turns reading the "letters" (NASB):

1 Cor. 13:13 - But now faith, hope, love, abide these three; but the greatest of these is love.

Ask / Discuss:

Paul lists the three great attributes we should have, but which one is the greatest? (Love)





Let's look at one more verse, but this one is in Paul's letter to the church in Colossae.

Let the students take turns reading the "letters" (NASB):


Col. 3:12-14 – So, as those who have been chosen of God, holy and beloved, put on a <u>heart</u> of compassion, kindness, humility, gentleness and patience; bearing with one another, and forgiving each other...just as the Lord forgave you, so also should you. Beyond all these things put on <u>love</u>, which is the perfect bond of <u>unity</u>.

Ask / Discuss:


Paul again lists several attributes that we need to have as Christians...compassion, kindness, humility, gentleness, patience, forgiveness. But he says above all these others, to put on love. Why is love so important? (Love is what bonds us in unity—in one body.) Love is what makes all these other attributes easier. It's hard to be compassionate or kind towards someone, if you don't first love that person. Paul wants these brethren, and us today, to have a loving attitude toward each other and all mankind.

(After the lesson, have the students put "The Epistles" in the correct mailboxes.)
